ORGANIZATION OF PUBLIC SERVICE: EUROPEAN EXPERIENCE

The article based on the study and practice of foreign countries and using comparative characteristics analyses main conceptual provisions of public services. Some aspects of foreign experience can be used in the development of Ukrainian public service in the context of administrative reform in Ukraine.

Formation of public service and its regulation is a complex process that does not happen instantly but takes time. For modern Ukraine, many challenges of the state formation were extremely difficult because of the burden of the Soviet past and the lack of sufficient knowledge in the field of democratic governance. The institute of public service also belonged to undeveloped and studied in certain ideological framework issues.

The study and use of the experience of foreign countries will help to more accurately define the place of public service in the public service development trends in Ukraine, and reflect new notions, concepts, and models for their later use in the power-management sector and in the life of society.

The purpose of the article is an analysis of the practice of foreign countries on the main conceptual provisions of public services that can be used in the development of Ukrainian civil service.

The conducted analysis shows that there is no common approach to public service because there is a significant difference in definitions and areas of distribution (in the broad or narrow sense) of public-service relations and in modern models of public service. The public service in each country is the original system with its traditional differences caused by cultural pluralism and the existence of regional influences.
