THE INFLUENCE OF INTERNATIONAL LABOUR LAW ON THE FORMATION OF THE UKRAINIAN LABOUR LEGISLATION

Due to the active work on the draft Labour Code of Ukraine, which is in the second reading, the issue of compatibility of the legal act with international standards and the realities of modern Ukraine is becoming of particular interest in the scientific community.

Today, there is a need for a detailed study of international treaties of Ukraine and laws of Ukraine on labour in order to identify conflicts, gaps, and development of methodological foundations of their overcoming and resolving. This issue is considered by legal scholars, including employment law specialists, such as Yeromenko V.V., Melnik K.V., Protsyshyn M.V., Inshyn M.I., Hrekova M.M., Venediktov V.S. and others.

The purpose of the article is to conduct an analysis and determination of the status and problems of adaptation of Ukrainian labour legislation to the system of international standards in the field of protection of labour rights.

The article based on the norms of national and international labour law and given the need for the new Labour Code of Ukraine studies the influence of international labour law on the Ukrainian labour legislation. A compliance of the Labour Code of Ukraine with international standards and realities of the modern Ukraine is analysed.

In summary, we note that in Ukraine today, there is an important phase of development of labour law as the draft Labour Code should be the main regulator of the employment relationship and, therefore, must contain the following provisions that practically embodied would have international experience in regulating labour relations and characteristics of the national labour legislation.
