**THE APPLICATION OF PROCEDURAL RULES IN INTERNATIONAL
PEACEKEEPING OPERATIONS (RELEVANT ISSUES
AT THE LEVEL OF THE NATIONAL LEGISLATION)**

Modern international relations as humanity as a whole are experiencing significant changes, which are primarily related to globalization processes. They permeate the life of the human community and in particular have an impact on every single person. Based on the fact that in modern conditions, states are interrelated and any problem (social, political, religious, ecological) that occurred in one country can impact on neighbouring and even very distant countries and regions, today humanity faces a serious task – to create a mechanism to overcome and prevent crises and crisis phenomena that can lead to accidents. One of the mechanisms to prevent and overcome crises is peace operations. At present, a pressing issue is the application of procedural rules in international peacekeeping operations, as experts say, the reason for this lies in the unresolved contradiction between the fundamental principles of international law – the right of na-

tions to self-determination and the right of individual states to the sovereignty and territorial integrity.

Note, however, that the problem of application of procedural rules of the national law in international peacekeeping operations did not become the subject of a separate study of local researchers. To some extent, there are revealed aspects of the rules regarding activities of the Armed Forces of Ukraine in international peacekeeping operations.

The article deals with current issues of the national law concerning the application of procedural rules in international peacekeeping operations. It is noted that “law of war” at the current stage of peacekeeping is not able to fully regulate all vital issues of enforceability. The author proposed to improve the national military law by organizing a legal institution – the right of the armed forces.
